It is important to note that the security, charging and care of the device will be the responsibility of the student.

We are asking that if you are considering purchasing a device for your child, please explore the school division's website (CESD BYOD LINK) as they provide all the necessary information for you to be sure that you are buying a device that is compatible and appropriate for use on our school network.

If you have questions or concerns about how the device may be used, please talk to the classroom teacher. Thank you for considering BYOD as a way to support your child's learning here at IMS.

We are still diligently following COVID protocols and appreciate your help in keeping our school community safe and healthy. If your child is sick or not feeling well we appreciate you keeping your child home until they are feeling better.
